His signature method was screen printing and he often repeated the same image multiples times in a grid. His art style is known as Pop Art.

Glossary

abstract



Artwork that does not try to look exactly like real people, places or objects.

overlying



A printing technique where multiple, separate prints are layered on top of each other to create depth and texture.

Pop Art



A bold, colourful style of art that began during the 1950s and 60s turning everyday items into art.

repetition



The technique of using the same element – such as shape, line or colour – multiple times in a single piece.

screen printing



A process that involves pushing ink through a mesh screen onto a surface.
