Glossary	
<p>line</p>	<p>Lines can often give an artwork a sense of movement. For example, organic lines can create a sense of flowing movement, while geometric line can create a rigid feel or no movement in an artwork.</p>
<p>overlay</p>	<p>An artist might overlay one piece of paper, for example tissue paper, on another in a collage.</p>
<p>Screen printing</p>	<p>Screen printing is a popular printing method, using a process that presses ink through a mesh screen in order to create a printed design. It's used in a huge range of industries across the globe to create custom clothing, canvasses, artwork, posters, and more</p>
<p>relief printing</p>	<p>Relief printing is when you carve into a printing block that you then use to press onto paper and make a print. The lines or shapes you carve into the printing block will not have ink on them, so will not show up on your paper.</p>
