- adapted** How something has adjusted.
- alive** Something that is living.
- carnivore** An animal that just eats meat.
- conditions** The state of something.
- dead** Something that was living but is not anymore.
- food chain** A series of living things that feed from each other.
- habitat** The place in which a living thing lives.
- herbivore** An animal that just eats plants.
- living** Something that is alive.
- microhabitat** A small habitat conditions
- omnivore** An animal that eats both plants and

We can group animals depending on what type of food they eat.

Herbivores eat plants.

Carnivores just eat meat.

Omnivores eat both plants and meat,



A habitat is where a living thing lives. Habitats provide things that living things need for life, such as food, water and air.
