| Glossary                                      |  |
| line  | Line is the path of a moving point. Lines define the edges of shapes and forms.  |
| printing                                      | Printing is making images that can be transferred onto other surfaces. It can be used to make one or more identical images or to create repeating patterns on papers and textiles. |
| collage<br>(coller in French meaning to glue) | A collage is a piece of art made by sticking various different materials such as photographs and pieces of paper or fabric on to a backing.  |
| portrait                                      | A portrait is a painting or other picture of a person, especially the head and shoulders.  |
| Giuseppe Archimboldo<br>1526-1593             | Giuseppe Arcimboldo was an Italian painter best known for creating imaginative portrait heads made entirely of objects such as fruits, vegetables, flowers, fish and books.        |
