

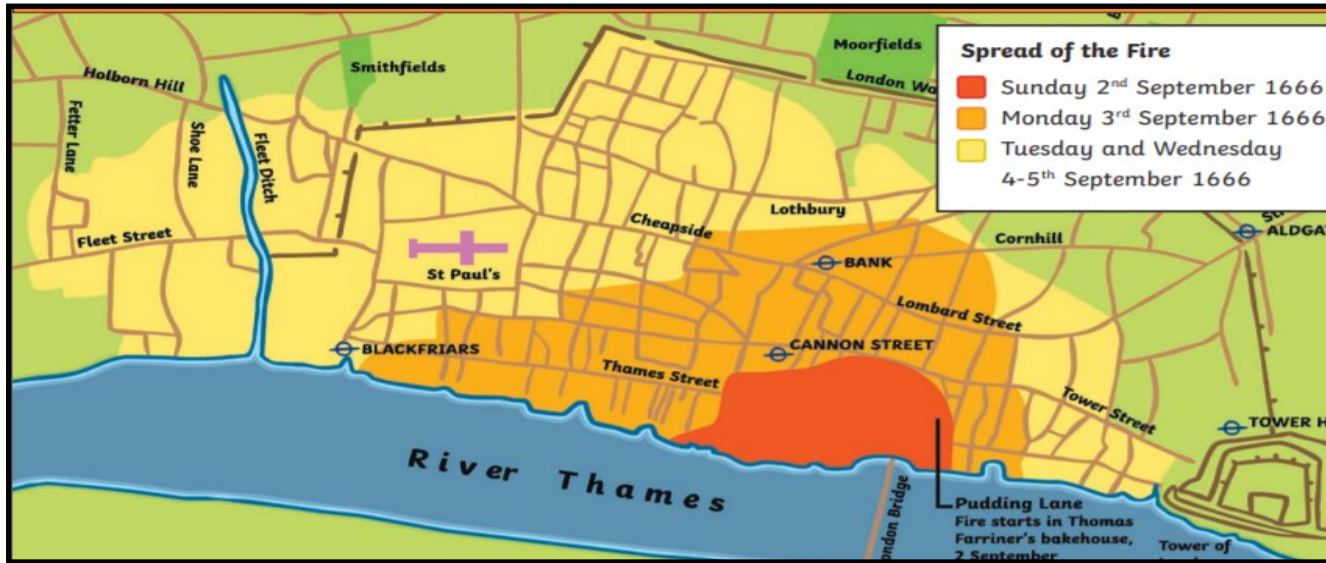

Glossary

- architect** A person who is qualified to design buildings.
