accents

Accents indicate the vowel is stressed. As seen in the word **increíble**.

stress placement

Words that end in a vowel, 'n' or 's' are normally stressed on the second to last syllable Like **di-ver-ti-do**.

silent letters

'H' is always silent in Spanish as in the word **horrible** (unless it is a word of foreign origin). It is pronounced 'orrible'.

vocabulary

Telling the time around the clock in Spanish.
