



Headlines

- 11 clubs on offer over the Summer Term, covering drama, music, sport, creative, environmental, tech based, academic (not listed on here) and some 'just for fun'.
- As soon as SATS were completed, Year 5 children have now been targeted for this term's Maths SATS Club, in preparation for Year 6.
- Year 6 maths data was up on last year (at 75%) so the Maths SATS Clubs that ran in the Spring Term supported this up-turn in data.
- 7 children in Band Club with the 5 children noticed in the Spring Term still attending.
- 2 teaching assistants willing to run after school clubs this term.

- Performing Arts Club, finished with an end of year performance at the Hall for Cornwall!
- 100% of EAL children attended a club this term.
- Numbers of PPG children attending fell from 31 (Autumn) to 27 (Spring) to 19 (Summer).
- Year 6 have the lowest number of children attending a club (but they are just about to leave so we can understand the reluctance to join a club)
- More girls than boys attended a club in the Summer Term

Next steps

- Add Summer Term analysis to website
- In September, relaunch clubs in 'Meet the Teacher' meetings
- Conduct a quick survey or informal conversations with PP families to identify barriers (Transport or timing issues, lack of awareness or interest)
- Personal Invitations: Send tailored letters or texts to PP families highlighting the benefits of specific clubs
- Visual Promotion: Use photos/videos of children enjoying clubs on newsletters and school social media
- Pupil Voice: Let children present clubs in assemblies or create posters to encourage peers
- Survey pupils in September and ask what clubs they'd love to attend, then adapt offerings accordingly.
- Offer a light snack/drink at clubs to keep energy up after school
- Speak to TAs about what we could offer to tempt them to do a Club (maybe a rota?)
- Ask MK to contact Brannel to see if there are any junior sport leads who might support a sport club at school (netball/cricket/athletics etc...)
