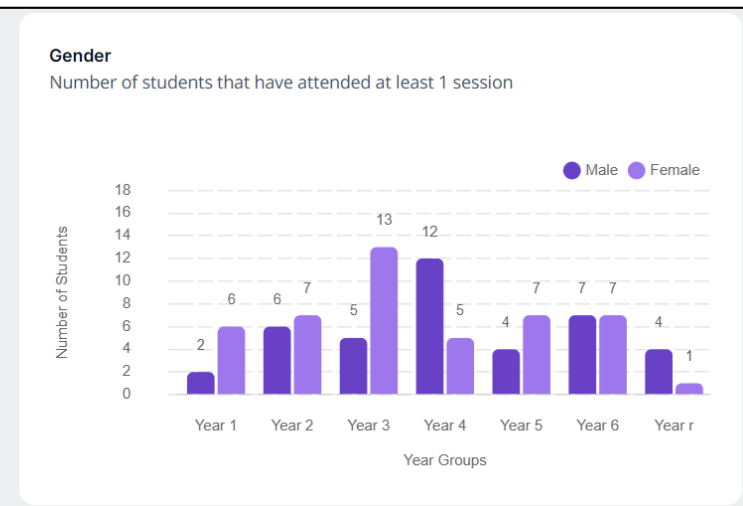
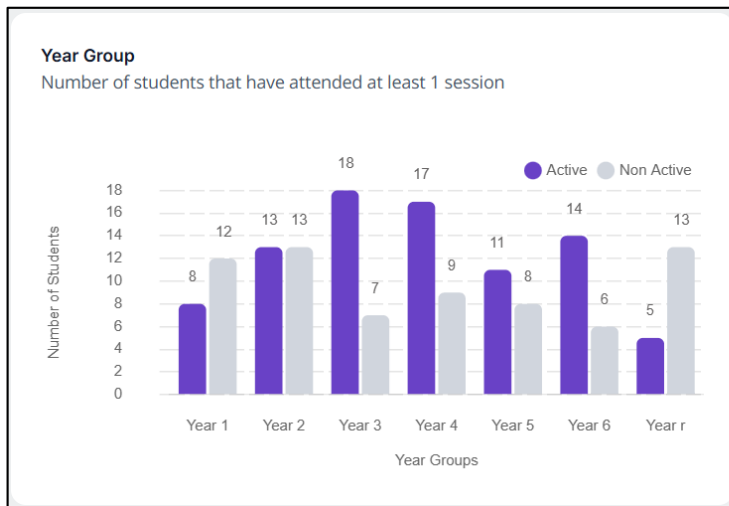
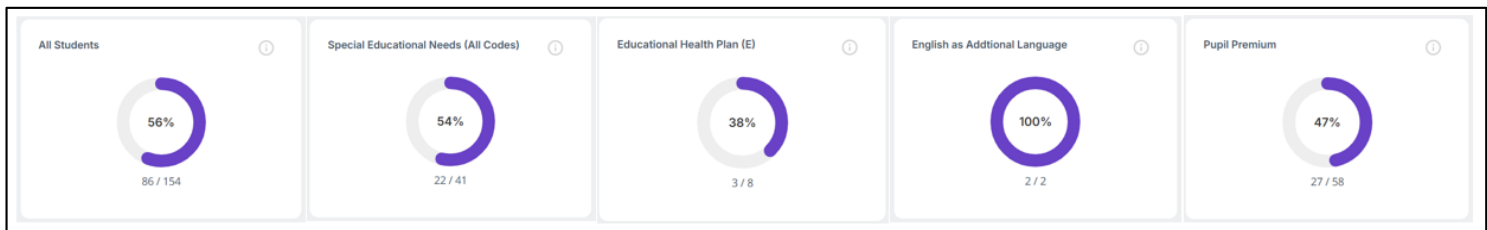

Headlines

- 15 clubs on offer over the Spring Term, covering drama, music, sport, creative, environmental, tech based, academic and real-life skills.
- Once again, data from mock SATS assessments has shown a massive improvement in the targeted children from Maths SATS Club, for Year 6 pupils in preparation for tests. Additionally to this, teaching staff have also targeted other pupils during lunchtimes.
- 1 new technology-based club this term (just for girls)- Cyber Guardians Club.
- Numbers at Band club rose from 1 to 5. St Dennis Band Club now have 5 children who are good enough to join the village band.
- 5 teaching assistants willing to run after school clubs this term.
- Numbers of children involved in clubs, rose from 79 in Autumn to 86 in Spring.
- Cyber Guardians Club ended with a trip for the 5 attendees.
- Numbers rose for Performing Arts Club, which has extended provision into next half term as there will be an end of year performance for parents
- 22 SEN pupils attended a club (up from 18 in Autumn) and 50% of children with an EHCP were enrolled in a club this term. Sensory Club has been accessible for SEN children.
- 100% of EAL children attended a club this term.
- Once again, club registers closed after 3 weeks to allow for any changes.
- Numbers of PPG children attending fell from 31 to 27.
- Reception and Year 1 have the lowest number of children attending a club (but they are the youngest children so we can understand the reluctance to join a club)

Next steps

- Update the website with current photos of clubs and comments from the children.
- Teachers to target PPG children once again in the first few weeks.
- Set up a club to target Rec/Year 1 children.
- Contact Brannel to see if there are any junior sport leads who might support a sport club at school (netball/cricket/athletics etc. . .)
