



### Headlines

- Feedback was collated from the parent questionnaire at the end of the Summer Term to inform choice of clubs for Autumn.
- Daily allocation of clubs meant that at least two clubs were available every day of the week.
- New twice weekly opening of the school Library (not on the dashboard) for families to either stay and read, or to borrow books.
- Although number of clubs on offer decreased from 15 in Summer Term to 12 on offer in the Autumn, on two afternoons the library was open to families and there were two after school maths revision sessions, plus lunchtime clubs (all not shown on the dashboard).
- Still a good range of clubs on offer from drama, music, sport, creative, academic and real-life skills.
- Two new technology/Science-based clubs this term-STEM and animation.

- Band Club and Singing still run by trained volunteers/professional musicians.
- Netball taught by an outside volunteer.
- Two teaching assistants still willing to run after school clubs.
- Numbers of children involved in clubs, increased in every year group, compared with the Summer Term analysis.
- Football Club and Netball Club were over-subscribed, so we increased the places to accommodate this.
- Performing Arts Club culminated with an end of term performance for parents again.
- Club registers again closed after 3 weeks to allow for any changes.
- Staff were given club lists and asked to encourage parents to let their children attend clubs in parent meetings.
- All groups saw a higher number of children attending clubs across the board this term- SEND from 8% to 55%, EHCP from 25% to 50%, PPG from 31% to 55% and All Students from 31.2% to 53%.
- Decision was made to not open clubs up to Reception children in the first term of school. Will discuss with staff around plan for either Spring or Summer Term.
- Need to speak to Band Club as only one child attended, so may need to look at the viability of this club.
- Singing may change to accommodate a new funded scheme (see next steps below).

#### Next steps

TECgirls are offering two funded after school clubs with all resources, if a member of staff can run them.

Email has gone out to staff already.

CYC Bridges is an organisation that works with SEND, vulnerable and at risk children, and provide valuable tailor-made learning opportunities to enrich musical, social and personal growth and development. School will host their 10-week project for 8 selected children, to support them in the formation of their own choir/singing club.
